Mr. Wydner made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Bondurant to not pursue a loan for the project at this time and to withdraw the application until grant monies are offered. The motion passed 5-0. Messrs. Bondurant, Kilgore, Mottley, Swisher and Wydner voted "Aye".

Mr. Wydner made a motion that was seconded by Mr. Kilgore to adopt a resolution endorsing a series of planning grant applications to the Virginia Department of Health. The motion passed 5-0. Messrs. Bondurant, Kilgore, Mottley, Swisher and Wydner voted "Aye". A copy of the resolution is attached and made a part of these minutes.

The Town Council discussed the idea of hosting a final Centennial thank you/wrap-up event. After the Council was reminded that the final Springsted worksession on the sewer capital improvement plant is scheduled for August 17 at 7:00 P.M., and there being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:05 P.M.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF AMHERST BY AMENDING CHAPTER 18.1 WHICH REFERS TO THE ZONING AND SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Town of Amherst:

1. That the Code of the Town of Amherst is hereby amended by amending Chapter 18.1, Zoning and Subdivision Ordinance, of the Town Code according to the summary indicated below. A copy of the full text of the revised ordinance shall be maintained within the Town Code.

§18.1-901 :	Establishes solar panel setbacks and size limits and revise rules for satellite dishes.
§18.1-906:	Establishes standards for streets and driveways inside a "multifamily" (apartment or
	condominium) complex.
§18.1-919 :	Clarifies that VDOT's "527" traffic impact study regulations are effective in the Town.
§18.1-920:	Adjusts landscaping requirements for commercial developments.
§18.1-1011 :	Clarifies application deadlines for plats and site plans.
§18.1-1102 :	Establishes an expiration date for site plan approvals.
§18.1-1103 :	Clarifies the administration of site plans for large residences being converted to businesses
§18.1-1402 :	Eliminates the variance hardship requirement per the change to Sec. 15.2-2309 of the Code
	of Virginia that removed the "approaching confiscation" clause and other updates per the
	Code of Virginia.
Chapter 18.1:	Allows day care facilities in R: 1, R: 2, R: 3 and R: 4 districts by special use permit; allows
	"retail uses not specifically delineated" by right in commercial zones but require all items
	offered for retail to be under roof or outside materials screened; and clarifies "contractor"
	uses – i.e. outside storage of materials or equipment, parking lots, etc. (in Table 7.1).
Chapter 18.1:	Updates subdivision regulations in Articles XII and XIII.

2. That this Ordinance shall be effective on August 11, 2010.

WHEREAS, the Rutledge Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant laboratory was accredited as a Certified Laboratory on June 15, 2010 and is one of only ten out of over 300 small Virginia plants to have achieved this status; and

WHEREAS, this is a significant accomplishment for the plant operation crew as it involved a significant amount of paperwork and about 500 man-hours of their time since January 2009 which probably avoided consulting fees of \$15-20,000 if the effort had been outsourced; and

WHEREAS, the most significant effect of this is that the Town will be able to continue to do much of the required routine testing in-house for BOD (2/wk), total suspended solids (2/wk) and pH (1/d) and thereby avoid logistical problems with dealing with an off-site laboratory every day; and

WHEREAS, the plant operations crew estimates that it would cost about \$4,056/yr plus shipping and handling to outsource the lab work but in-house costs will cost only about \$1,000/yr (\$700 for testing supplies and machines plus the \$300/yr accreditation fee); and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Amherst wishes to acknowledge the services and contributions from certain individuals to the Town of Amherst;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Amherst does, on this date, acknowledge the outstanding service that the plant operations crew members Gary Williams and Shannon Higgins have given our community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Amherst hereby declares that the Town of Amherst's operation has been improved as a result of their work at Rutledge Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Council of the Town of Amherst is ordered to deliver an original copy of this Resolution to Gary Williams and Shannon Higgins as a token of the Council's deep appreciation of their contributions to our community.
