General Definition of Work

Performs difficult protective service work investigating crime scenes, gathering and securing evidence, interviewing victims, witnesses and suspects, maintaining records and files, preparing reports and related work as apparent or assigned. Work is performed under the general direction of the Police Lieutenant.

Qualification Requirements

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable an individual with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Essential Functions

Conducts initial and follow-up investigations of criminal incidents; interviews victims, witnesses and suspects in connection with criminal incidents; secures crime scenes.

Communicates and exchanges information with and assists other law enforcement agencies and personnel.

Secures warrants and affidavits; serves warrants; makes arrests.

Meets with Commonwealth's Attorneys in preparation for court and victim assistance; testifies in court.

Prepares written criminal and administrative reports producing reports that accurately reflect and document interviews, actions and investigations; maintains files and records.

Schedules polygraphs; records results; presents findings.

Conducts investigations; processes crime scenes; photographs crime scene; conducts surveillance; secures and transports evidence to and from lab; instructs lab personnel as to appropriate tests; destroys evidence no longer needed.

Orders equipment and supplies.

Conducts additional administrative duties, patrol duties or special assignments, as assigned. Engages in public relations, community service activities and events to build cooperative and collaborative relationships with the community.

Maintains liaisons and professional working relationships with local, State and Federal agencies.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Thorough knowledge of law enforcement methods, practices and procedures; thorough knowledge of law enforcement investigative principles and techniques of identification; thorough knowledge of evidence and laws of search and seizure; thorough knowledge of department rules and regulations; thorough knowledge of the geography of the Town and location of important buildings; thorough knowledge of preparing various reports and related documents; general knowledge of the use of standard office equipment and associated software; thorough knowledge of the use of the equipment required for the position (e.g. police vehicle, DNA kit, Intoxilizer, Taser, OC spray, radio, etc.); general knowledge of the use of data systems (e.g. NCIC/VCIN, Virginia Law Enforcement Exchange System, etc.); ability to understand and carry out oral and written instructions and to prepare clear comprehensive reports; ability to deal courteously, firmly and tactfully with the public; ability to analyze situations and adopt quick, effective and reasonable courses of action with due regard to surrounding hazards and circumstances; ability to make arithmetic computations using whole numbers, fractions and decimals; ability to compute

rates, ratios and percentages; ability to understand and apply governmental accounting practices in maintenance of financial records; skill in the use of firearms; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with associates, victims, witnesses, suspects, attorneys and the general public.

Education and Experience

High school diploma or GED and considerable experience in law enforcement, or equivalent combination of education and experience.

Physical Requirements
