At the regular meeting of the town council held Friday night April 1st, 1921, in the mayors office, present W.W.Gilbert, mayor, presiding, P.R.Evans, O.V.Hanger, W.A.Baldeck and R.M.Cox.

On motion of W.A.Baldeck seconded by O.V.Hanger the council adopted the following ordinance, entitled "Silent Policeman".

BE IT ORDAINED by the council for the Town of Amherst Virginia, that the "Silent Policeman" placed in the intersection of Main Street

and the depot road shall direct traffic at that point, and the following regulations are hereby adopted governing said traffic:

(1) Any person or persons riding or driving any horse, horses or any other animal or animals, or any person or persons operating or driving any mechanically propelled vehicle or conveyance, who shall approach within 75 feet or pass the aforesaid street intersection from any direction, such person or persons shall keep to the right of the said "Silent Policeman"

(2) No person or persons, when driving or riding as aforesaid, shall pass said street intersection at a greater speed than 10 miles an hour.

(3) Any person violating this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$2.50, nor more than \$100.00.

(4) This ordinance shall be in effect from the 16th day of April 1921.

On motion of O.V.Hanger seconded by W.A.Baldeck the following resolutions were adopted by the council.

Be it resolved that a sign setting out the speed limit at the intersection of the depot road and main Street, be placed about 75 feet from said intersection on the right hand side of the road on each road approaching said intersection.

Be it resolved by the council of the Town of Amherst, that in regard to the moving of certain poles belonging to the Amherst Telephone Co. owned by L.V.Parr in the Town of Amherst that the same shall be under the direction of the Street Committee of said town, and that the actual work shall be done jointly by L.V. Parr and W.A.Baldeck as representing the Electric Light Co., and Telephone Co., Resp. and the cost of ~~xxxxx~~ labor, poles and other material ~~xxxxx~~ shall be agreed upon by the said Baldeck and Parr and an itemized account of such expenditures shall be certified to the Town of Amherst, upon receipt of such account, said Town to pay two thirds thereof and L.V.Parr one third. It is further understood that neither Mr. Parr or Mr. Baldeck shall charge for the overseeing of this work. It is further understood that the work on said phone line and ~~xxxxxxxxxx~~ changes made therein as far as construction is concerned shall be acceptable to said L.V.Parr.

Mr. L.V.Parr and his attorney Mr. Edward Meeks being present

at the council agreed to the above resolution.
